This pre-application form is designed to determine if the applicant and the project proposed meet the minimum qualifications. In order to make an accurate determination, all information on the pre-application form needs to be complete to the extent possible. Please note that due to the nature of the revolving loan program, the available fund resources vary based on outstanding loans previously made and other factors. You should contact the Nevada Brownfields Program Coordinator to determine if the fund value is adequate to meet your needs before you begin the pre-application process.
