



NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION

The Administrator, Division of Environmental Protection, Carson City, Nevada is issuing the following notice of proposed action under the Nevada Revised Statutes and/or the Clean Water Act, where applicable. The Administrator has received an application for a Groundwater Discharge, permit number NS2026500 from the following applicant:

Permit NS2026500, TERRIBLE'S TRUCK STOP AND TRAVEL CENTER:

The Permittee, Terrible Herbst Inc., has applied for groundwater discharge permit NS2026500 to discharge domestic sewage to holding tanks located at the proposed Terrible's Truck Stop and Travel Center facility at 8420 N. Las Vegas Boulevard in North Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada. The nine (9) 5,000-gallon holding tanks, installed in three (3) rows of three (3) tanks, (total capacity is 45,000-gallons), shall be used to collect and temporarily store domestic sewage. The sewage stored in the holding tanks will be regularly pumped and sent for treatment at a permitted facility.

On the basis of preliminary review of the requirements of the Nevada Revised Statutes, as amended, and implementing regulations, the Administrator proposes to issue Permit NS2026500 to discharge for a five (5) year period, subject to certain effluent limitations.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations by the Administrator regarding permit issuance should submit their comments or request, in writing, hand delivered or postmarked no later than 5:00 P.M. on 10/06/2025, either in person or by mail to:

The request must be filed within the comment period and must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received within the thirty (30) day period will be considered in the formulation of final determination(s) regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations. Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time.

A public hearing on the proposed determination can be requested by the Permittee, any affected State, any affected interstate agency, the Regional Administrator of EPA Region IX or any interested agency, person or group of persons. The request must be filed within the comment period and must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. Any public hearing determined by the Administrator to be held must be conducted in the geographical area of the proposed discharge or any other area the Administrator determined to be appropriate. All public hearings must be conducted to accordance with NAC 445A.238.
