NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION

The Administrator, Division of Environmental Protection, Carson City, Nevada is issuing the following notice of proposed action under the Nevada Revised Statutes and/or the Clean Water Act, where applicable. The Administrator has received an application for a Groundwater Discharge, permit number NS2024513 from the following applicant:

NEVADA GOLD MINES LLC-CORTEZ DISTRICT

Permit NS2024513, NEVADA GOLD MINES - CORTEZ DISTRICT:

This is a major modification (Effective July 2026):

The permit authorizes 12 On-Site Disposal Systems (OSDS) for restrooms at Nevada Gold Mines LLC – Cortez District, with a total capacity of 55,900 gallons. The Mine Plan Area, which includes the Gold Acres, Pipeline, Cortez, and Cortez Hills complexes, encompasses approximately 58,093 acres. Of this total, 54,825 acres are public lands managed by the BLM Mount Lewis Field Office, and 3,268 acres are private lands.

Due to rotating shifts at Cortez, the number of employees onsite fluctuates throughout each shift. As of September 2025, an average of 2,800 employees were present across the areas serviced by these septic systems. Solid waste pumped from the septic tanks is transported to the Desert Disposal facility at 8965 Jungo Road, Winnemucca, NV 89445, under permit NS2004511, for land application.

Outfall ST7 (Mill 1 Septic Tank): Replacement with a new system consisting of a 12,000-gallon septic tank and a 4,000-gallon dosing tank.

Outfall LF7 (Mill 1 Leach Field): Replacement with a leach field totaling 1,512 linear feet (14 runs of 108 feet each).

The existing system will be decommissioned in accordance with NDEP Water Technical Sheet No. 23 (WTS-23), Criteria for On-site Sewage Disposal Systems Including Commercial and Multiple-Dwelling Structures, and NDEP WTS-20 Facility Abandonment Closure Plans (Section B- Septic Tanks).

On the basis of preliminary review of the requirements of the Nevada Revised Statutes, as amended, and implementing regulations, the Administrator proposes to issue Permit NS2024513 to discharge for a five (5) year period, subject to certain effluent limitations.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations by the Administrator regarding permit issuance should submit their comments or request, in writing, hand delivered or postmarked no later than 5:00 P.M. on 06/01/2026, either in person or by mail to:

The request must be filed within the comment period and must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received within the thirty (30) day period will be considered in the formulation of final determination(s) regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations. Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time.

A public hearing on the proposed determination can be requested by the applicant, any affected state, any affected interstate agency, the Regional Administrator of EPA Region IX, or any interested agency, person, or group of persons. The request must be filed within the comment period and must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. Any public hearing determined by the Administrator to be held must be conducted in the geographical area of the proposed discharge or any other area the Administrator determines to be appropriate. All public hearings must be conducted in accordance with NAC 445A.238.
